Services: Nevada County APS investigates reports of abuse of elder and dependent adults who reside within county borders. Elder adults in California are defined as anyone 65 years of age, and dependent adults are defined as disabled adults between the ages of 18 – 64. When referred and assigned, APS social workers will investigate when elder and dependent adults are victims of abuse, neglect or exploitation. Abuse means physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect (including self-neglect), financial abuse, isolation, abandonment, abduction, or other treatment that results in physical harm, pain, mental suffering, or loss or threat to property and assets.

Mission: The mission of the Department of Social Services is to administer public assistance and public social services programs to assure that all eligible and needy persons receive their correct entitlement in a timely and humane fashion, impartially and efficiently, in accordance with regulations and within applicable funding levels; to service the public in a courteous, nondiscriminatory manner; and to maintain a pleasant, safe, harmonious workplace.
